<u>American Political Science Association Diversity and Inclusion Resources</u>	Diversity and Inclusion	The site provides resources such as scholarship information, webinars, and syllabi for diversity and inclusion issues related to gender, sexuality, race, and ethnicity.
<u>APSA Latino Caucus Collection of Syllabi</u>	Latinx Policy and Politics	The collection of syllabi focuses on Latinx policy, immigration policy, and politics.
<u>The Brussels Binder</u>	Gender/ Women	The search engine groups women experts by issues of European governance, human rights issues, and foreign policy.
<u>Consortium on Gender, Security and Human Rights</u>	Gender and Security	The website provides resources focusing on gender in conflict, peacebuilding, and international politics. It includes syllabi, research, and multimedia.
<u>Foreign Policy Interrupted</u>	Gender/Women and Foreign Policy	This resource lists women experts in foreign policy grouped by country/organization and current topics in the news.

<u>People of Color Also Know Stuff</u>	People of Color in Political Science	The directory includes information and research topics of scholars in order to promote inclusion of people of color in syllabi and citations.
<u>Women Also Know Stuff</u>	Gender/Women and Political Science	#WomenAlsoKnowStuff organizes women scholars by topics such as international politics, conflict studies, human rights, and foreign policy.
