Gender Certificate Requirements

FOUNDATION COURSE (3 Credits): Gender, International Security & Development

This required cornerstone course is offered in both Fall and Spring semesters and provides essential knowledge for understanding the intersections of gender, international security, and development. It is strongly recommended to take this course early in your studies, preferably before enrolling in the Skills Course, as it provides the necessary theoretical and conceptual framework for the program.

SKILLS COURSE (3 Credits): Gender & Security Toolbox

This required skills course is essential to the certificate program and focuses on applying the theories and concepts introduced in the Foundation Course. Offered in both Fall and Spring semesters, it equips students with critical tools and perspectives necessary for engaging with the broader themes of gender and security.

FLEX (9 Credits):

- Additional coursework that applies a gender lens to security, diplomacy, development, or international affairs more broadly. To fulfill this requirement, students can:
 - Select from an approved list of courses.
 - Adapt a course, capstone project, or thesis to integrate a gender perspective into the assignments.
 - Submit previous coursework for consideration, provided it demonstrates an obvious and thorough engagement with a gender perspective.
- For courses not on the approved list, students must obtain written/email approval from the course instructor to apply a gender lens, share the course syllabus, and submit the main assignment where the gender lens was applied.
